## Excerpt from FAQ about Level 4 (SIG-priority) Schools

## Q: How does a school exit Level 4 status?

A: Level 4 schools can be moved out of status by fulfilling three criteria:

- a) Increase in student achievement for three years for students overall and for each subgroup of students, as shown by:
  - MCAS and student growth
  - Reduction in proficiency gap
  - (for high schools) higher education rate and evidence of increase in postsecondary success
- b) Evidence that the conditions are in place at the school level to sustain that improvement.
- c) Evidence that the conditions are in place at the <u>district</u> level to sustain that improvement.
