Patricia A. Mitchell, Ph.D., is the manager for the NCLB School Improvement Bureau, Office of Student Achievement and Accountability, in the New Jersey Department of Education. In this role she oversees the NJ Statewide System of Support, which includes the School Improvement Advisory Committee of Practitioners, the Collaborative Assessment for Planning and Achievement (CAPA) initiative, benchmark follow-up process, Title I Distinguished Schools, Reward Grants, School Restructuring, School Improvement Grants, and Blue Ribbon Schools. CAPA has been implemented since 2003 and is designed to build capacity in districts and schools in adopting effective practices that advance student achievement. Previously, Dr. Mitchell served as regional manager of the Program Improvement Regional Center North. In this position, she coordinated activities of 13 special needs districts and 240 schools as they implemented school reform programs. Dr. Mitchell is co-author of several publications associated with school culture and career education, including *Sending the Right Signals*, *ASETS-Achieving Sex Equity Through Students*, and *Mythbusters*. Dr. Mitchell trains at the state and national levels and currently conducts workshops on needs assessment, data analysis, and completion of school improvement plans.
